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VOLUNTARY REMEDIATION IN GEORGIA

Goals:

- Overcome regulatory barriers
- Achieve cost-effective cleanups
- Efficiently return properties as clean safe and ready for active reuse



GEORGIA BROWNFIELD PROGRAM

 Established in 2003 under the Hazardous Site Reuse and Redevelopment ("Brownfield") Act

 Employs cleanup standards promulgated under the Hazardous Site Response (state superfund) Act

GEORGIA'S APPROACH TO BROWNFIELD REDEVELOPMENT

- Recognizes that real estate redevelopment creates opportunity for environmental benefits
- Offers incentives for voluntary cleanup



ENTERING THE BROWNFIELD PROGRAM

- Must apply before taking title (or within the 30-day grace period following purchase)
- Conduct soil and groundwater investigation
- Cleanup of soil and source material to risk reduction (cleanup) standards
- File Compliance Status Report



BROWNFIELD INCENTIVES

• Liability limitation for prospective purchasers

• Tax incentive provides opportunity to recoup investigation and cleanup costs




RESULTS

- 726 brownfields applications received to date
- 8,000+ acres have been enrolled in the program
- 405 properties have completed the program and received final limitation of liability certificates

Over 3,000 acres certified ready for reuse



- Industrial redevelopment




PUBLIC –PRIVATE PARTNERSHIPS LEVERAGING FUNDS

- City and County governments can apply for EPA funding for assessment and clean up
- Use other federal grants to create incentives for redevelopment that meets needs of the community
- Look for local incentives (TADs)

VRP APPLICATIONS

- 107 Applications received
- 96 Applications approved
- 8 Applications under review
- 6 Applications withdrawn / removed
- (3 subsequent to approval)
- 15 Properties delisted



BROWNFIELD- UST PARTNERSHIPS

- Huge interest in redeveloping old gas stations
- Variety of uses
- UST is updating risk standards to be more compatible with brownfield, easier transition between programs
- Works well with EPA grant opportunities
